Dry Storage Keeps Seed Corn Fertile

Seed corn should be stored in a dry, well ventilated place over the winter if it is to produce a good yield of high quality corn the following season.

Carelessly stored seed may so cetericate during the winter that it cannot produce a good stand of corn. The ears of seed corn should not bt thrown together in a pile, but should be stored in such a manner that the air can circulate freely about each ear.

Given a cnance to dry out thor-cughly before cold weather, the seed will be able to withstand heavy freezes without injury.

A satisfactory hanger can be made with woven wire and a couple of two-by-four uprights. The meshes of the wire should be just large enough to permit the ears to pass through Ensity

The uprights should be erected a convenient distance apart, with the broad edge set at right angles to a ne drawn between the two posts.




