nesville, and H. A. Osborne Lumber Company of Canton. These privies can be secured without cost for labor for building and installing by making application to the supervisor of the project, and paying the lumber company for materials used in them. We highly recommend the procuring of the concrete slab and riser with the seat, even though rough material may be used in constructing them. Although as I have previously stated, the construction of an all wood privy meeting the requirements of the State Board of Health is acceptable. There have been 60 concrete slab privies already installed in this area, and there are more than 100 orders for the construction, which will be delivered as promptly as possible, and so long as the WPA project continues.

"Typhoid fever is spread only by the ingestion of germs eliminate from the digestive tract and a carrier of a human case or carrier through pollution of the food and water supply. It was found in making this survey that the water supply of the homes comprising this area is as follows:

Open springs, 502.
Open wells, 245.
Protected wells, 84.
Protected springs, 13.
Running water, 69.

"It can be readily seen that proper sewage disposal in any area is a great protection against the spread of typhoid fever locally where so much of the water supply is subject to pollution."

Dr. Sisk Explains Situation Regarding Canton's Watershed

Survey Shows That 952 Homes on Canton's New Watershed. State Law Is Explained

The following is a statement from Dr. C. N. Sisk, District Health Officer concerning the facts relative to the Canton watershed:

"Because of various rumors, many of which are erroneous, I desire to make a statement concerning the sanitation of the drainage area of the Canton watershed, which will comprise a large part of Pigeon, Cecil, and East Fork townships. The public laws of North Carolina of many years standing give any municipality in the state authority to condemn lands, and to enforce sanitary requirements in providing a safe water supply for their citizens. The laws being applied in this instance are state-wide and were not made specifically for Canton.

"The only items of sanitation applicable to a watershed are satisfactory disposal of sewage, the proper disposal of bodies of dead animals occurring on the watershed, and the location of cemeteries. Any statement concerning not being able to keep live stock on the watershed is

entirely erroneous. The health department has recently completed a survey of this area, and find there are 952 homes in the area. An analysis of the sanitation as these homes show 418 with no system of sewage disposal, 386 with pit privies, 63 with surface privies, 46 with privies over branches, and 59 with septic tanks. Among this number 71 privies were approved, 813 were recommended to install concrete slab privies with new buildings, 27 with concrete slabs with the use of the present building, 21 because of inaccessibility were recom-

mended to build wood privies, and 20 were recommended to build septic tanks.

"The health department can only require of any individual compliance with the state sanitary law, which permits an all wood privy. However, we have recommended to all residents of this area the procuring of a concrete slab and riser privy for permanency and satisfactory service. This type of privy is now being built under a WPA project at the lumber yards of Hyatt & Company in Way-
