Leche, Lieut. Gov. Earl K. Long, brother of the late Kingfish, and Coleman Lindsay, president of the state senate, will be determined. Leche began his administration in a manner sharply in contrast to the dictatorial methods of Long when he signed an order removing all police and firemen from political control.

In most cases the lumbering industry and the field of transportation have been filled in this county by outsiders. Natives of Haywood have little, if any, interest in recreational centers; few are outstanding in the field of agriculture; and the only creamery in this county was recently opened and operated by those not native to this section."

Miss Lentz has given a number of demonstrations and is considered very good in this field of cheese making. It should be well worth the while of all of the farm women who have surplus milk to come to the demonstration and see just how to utilize the present supply of milk for consumption next winter or whenever it is wanted.

Cheese is a rich food and particularly useful in making other foods more attractive, more tasty, and more nourishing. Since it can be made in the home, there is no reason that the family should not have an abundance of it without having to buy it.
