

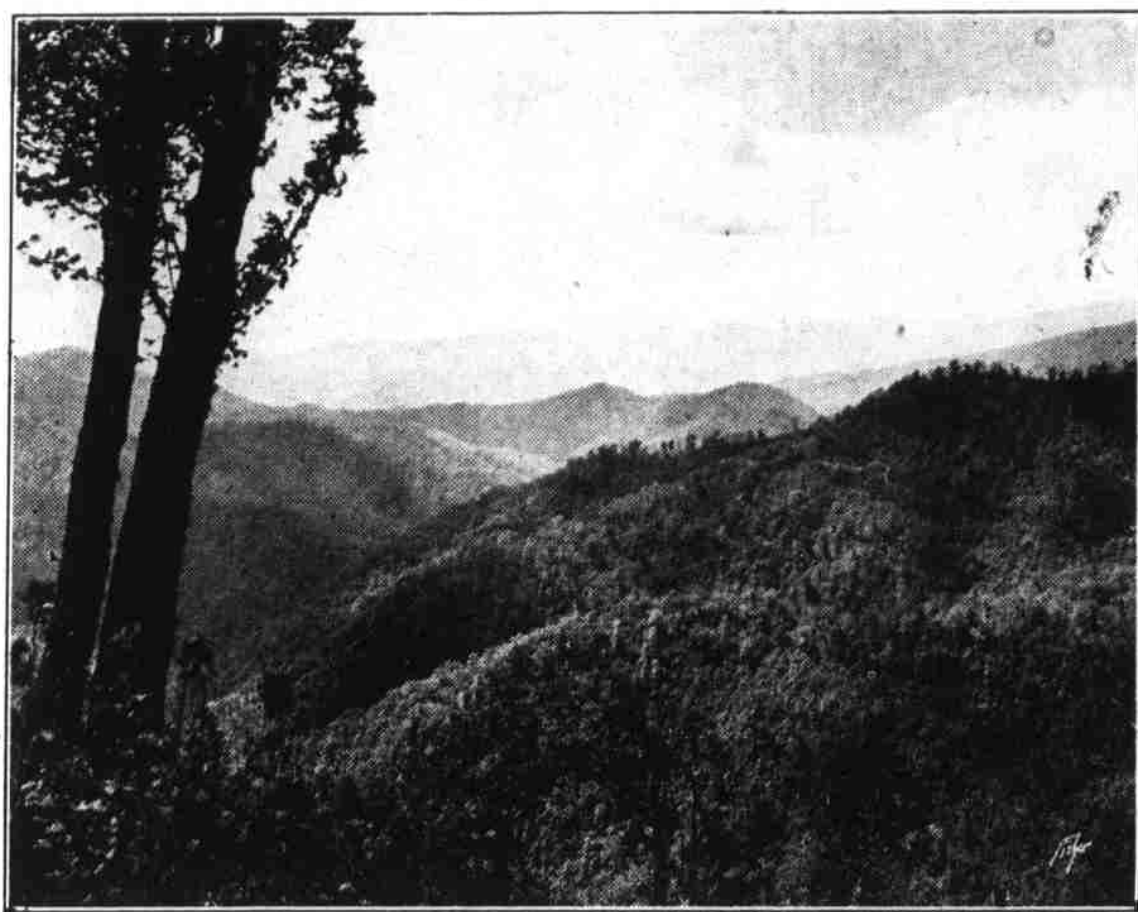

Barber Orchard Is One Of Largest In The Southern States

The Barber Apple Orchard on Highway No. 10, six miles south of Waynesville, en route to Balsam, produces under ordinary conditions approximately 75,000 bushels of apples. A large refrigeration plant, with a capacity of some 40,000 baskets of apples, was installed about two years ago. Another storage plant, known as common storage, has a capacity of approximately 20,000 baskets. These storage houses maintain an even temperature at around 32 degrees. A stationary power spraying system was also installed some time ago. This system required seven and a half miles of pipe line. But the system makes it possible to spray the whole orchard in 30 hours. Thirty men work in the orchard the year around, and during the picking season some 125 men are employed. Fourteen mules are used to do the necessary plowing.
