## New Football Season Reveals Changes In Many University Coaching Staffs

### Nation-Wide Survey Shows That More Than 100 Schools in U. S. Have Shifted Gridiron Mentors This Year

NEW YORK—A new football season brings a new crop of college gridiron aspirants—and a new crop of coaches.

A nation-wide survey reveals that 100 colleges and universities have changed coaches this year. Most of the changes in coaching personnel are in smaller colleges, but several of the larger schools have new appointments.

The University of Wisconsin, in the doldrums for some time, has ousted Dr. Clarence W. Spears and put in one of the immortal Four Horsemen, Harry Stuhldreher, for seven years a successful coach at Villanova. Spears hooked up with the University of Toledo.

Cornell, going through a bad season, has changed coaches, the veteran Gil Dobie being replaced by Carl Snaveley, mentor of the

North Carolina team. Dobie now is at Boston college. Snaveley's place at North Carolina has been taken by Ray (Bear) Wolf.

At Tulane, Lowell Dawson, former Tulane star, replaced Ted Cox, who in turn, succeeded A. A. Exendine at Oklahoma A. & M.

Bob Neyland returned to his former post at Tennessee after a year's absence, replacing his former assistant, Bill Britton. Clipper Smith quit Santa Clara to replace Stuhldreher at Villanova. Lawrence (Buck) Shaw, assistant to Smith, is now head coach at Santa Clara.

Other Changes Reported  
Ernie Nevers is new coach at Lafayette, the former Stanford All-American replacing Herb McCracken. Josh Cody, last year an assistant at Vanderbilt, went to the University of Florida to take the place of Dutch Stanley. Frank Dobson, former University of Richmond coach, is new head mentor

at University of Maryland. John P. Smith is successor to Christy Flanagan at Duquesne.

Judge Walter P. Steffen of Chicago returns to his old post as advisory coach at Carnegie Tech. Vic Hurt took "Gloomy Gus" Henderson's post at Tulsa university when the school and Gus couldn't agree on a contract. William Saunders stepped in at Denver when Percy Locey resigned. Jack Croft, line coach at Utah State, moves up to head coach at Montana State.

Among other new coaches are Tom Conley at John Carroll university, Wilbur White at Colorado Mines, Guy Lookabaugh at Grinnell, John Levi at Haskell, Elbert Caraway at Massachusetts State, Alvin Julian at Muhlenberg, Monk Simons at Transylvania, Jimmy Aiken at Akron, Elmer Holm at Washburn, Wendell Smith at Wheaton, Branch Bocock at William-Mary and Clem Crowe at Xavier.

and seed at the same time. When cut at a stage for making good hay the seed are immature, and when cut after the seed have thoroughly matured the hay is practically worthless for feed to livestock.  
Veazey pointed out that certain fields or areas of good stand should be left for seed production. Where lespedeza is to remain in the same field two years, he said, it is a good plan to cut the crop for hay the first year and harvest the seed the second year. Fields mowed for hay this year

which are to remain in lespedeza next year should not be cut too close to the ground or too late in the season as this will not allow sufficient seed for reseeding the next year's crop.

Cowpeas may be harvested by hand picking, Veazey said, and cleaned with a patent cleaning machine, or by cutting the whole plant and threshing, while soybeans should be harvested with a regular soybean harvester.

## Lespedeza Seed Should Be Saved

With indications pointing to the increased use of lespedeza as a soil-improvement and erosion control crop, A. H. Veazey, agronomist of the Soil Conservation Service, advised farmers to harvest an abundant supply of lespedeza seed for next spring planting.

Farmers who are growing Kobe, Tennessee 76 and common varieties, said Veazey, may harvest their seed with a pan attached to the mower.

Korean seed can be harvested with the seed pan attachment also, but the best method for harvesting Korean seed is to cut the whole plant after it has thoroughly matured or reached the chocolate brown color and thresh it with a grain thresher.

Seed of the Kobe, Tennessee 76 and common should not be harvested until well matured, according to the State College Extension Service. Lespedeza will not make good hay

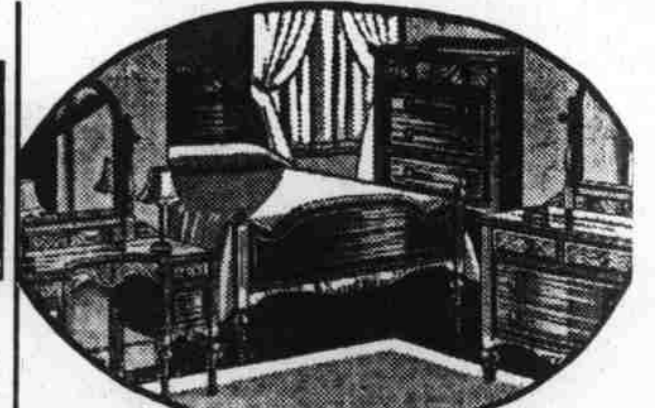
