At one time Mr. Shoolbred was city engineer of Waynesville. He has been employed on various jobs of construction for the Champion Fibre Company.

Mr. Shoolbred, who was highly respected by all who knew him, had a great capacity for making friends. Widely read and traveled, though modestly reserved, and with a keen sense of humor, he was a delightful companion. Interested at all times in community affairs he never failed to answer any call made upon him. He was a
