start January 6, and Governor-elect Clyde R. Hoey will take office January 7. Governor Ehrinhuis said an act conforming with the Federal ruling "has been practically completed and will be ready for presentation on the opening day of the (special) session, and can be quickly and fully considered either by special committee or committee of the whole and enacted in time for Christmas adjournment."

State officials searched the records for indications of how long the session may be expected to last and whether business besides unemployment insurance may be discussed.

They found:

1. Legislators will receive \$8 a day until the session is 20 days old. After that they will receive no pay.
2. In the five sessions previously called during the 20th century, none lasted longer than 20 days.
3. On only one of the five occasions (1908) was business of equal or greater importance than that for which the session was called.

If customary procedure is followed, party caucuses will be held the night before the session to nominate the speaker of the House and the President pro tem of the Senate.

No opposition for the speakership has been announced against Gregg Cherry, veteran House member from Gaston county, and A. Hall Johnston, of Asheville, is unopposed as president pro tem.

Another added feature to the Christmas season this year will be the musical program each day at noon and each afternoon at five o'clock, which will be broadcast over amplifiers in front of the Park Theatre.

J. E. Massie, owner of the theater, is having the system erected, and will furnish an operator each day. This novel feature is expected to begin on December 19th.

J. Dale Stentz, of the Chamber of Commerce, will be in charge to supplement the Christmas records which will be played, by rendering solos. Others will be asked to help from time to time.

The programs will be devoted exclusively to Christmas music. No announcements of any kind will be made over the system. Those in charge feel that the music can be heard for four blocks over the three loud speakers.

Mr. Stentz is requesting that anyone having any records of Christmas music please get in touch with him. He has acquired a number from Martin Electric Company, but wants others, if they are available.
