Control Of Social Diseases Studied

The conference held on the control of social diseases at the Central Elementary school, on Wednesday afternoon, was attended by approximately seventy-five teachers and others interested in this problem.

The conference was held primarily to emphasize the teaching of sex hygiene in the schools and to call attention to the splendid programs by the state.

The two principal talks were made by A. S. Combs, of the State Department of Education, and Dr. G. M. Leiby, of the State Board of Health.

Dr. Leiby illustrated his talk with lantern slides. He gave many alarming statistics on the number of persons afflicted, showing the effects, and offering solutions for the control of social diseases. He also spoke of the increase of cases in the schools in the state.
