The Mountaineer—
spending the past winter in
St. Augustine, Fla., I decided in March to go to
Miami and then to the Bahama Is-

lands. We went to New
York, on Green Turtle Bay. This
island has a population of 100
and was the hide-out for Black Beard,
the famous sea pirate. New Plym-
outh was his last outpost, and six
cannons now mark the site of
the town. The town was founded
100 years ago.

The chief occupation of the people
is fishing while their chief source of
income is from sponges, turtles, craw-
fish and shacks. The fins and hides of
the fish are valuable.

The town of New Plymouth is thor-
oughly isolated. There are no roads
leading from the town. It is built on
a hill, which is their only highway,
and their many types of boats are
automobiles. Mail is only deliv-
ered every two weeks.

When leaving New Plymouth, we sailed
for Nassau, about 160 miles away.
We were made at five towns en
route, but none of them with over
100 population.

Nassau is the capitol of the Bah-
amas and has a population of 20,000.
I spent three days in Nassau,
but decided not to wait longer for
it, but took an airplane over 160
miles of water to Miami. The plane
was the thrill of my life.

CCC Camps Will Be Operated 2 More Years

The House voted 385 to 7 Wednesday to extend for two years the life of the Civilian Conservation Corps, but stubbornly refused to make the administration "pet" permanent as urged by President Roosevelt. Thus the Senate became the President's only recourse for a permanent CCC. The House action was the greatest show of independence in that chamber since the "revolt" in 1935 against the "death sentence" in the utility holding company bill.

Charges Made That Spy Rings Operating In U. S. For Spain

Charges that a "spy ring" is operating in the United States in behalf of the Spanish Fascist insurgents were made by Senator Nye, North Dakota Republican, and Representative Bernard, Minnesota Farmer-Laborite. Their charges involved former Ambassador Juan Francisco de Cardenas and other former officials of the Spanish embassy. Nye filed with Senate translations of letters he said were written by members of a New York shipping firm, to various persons in Spain, Mexico, France and Cuba, many of the letters dealing with shipments of arms and supplies to the Spanish loyalists. Senator Nye, chairman of the old munitions investigation committee expressed belief that there is "strong sentiment" for a senatorial inquiry into all subversive influence and that he would introduce a resolution for such an investigation.
