

state unemployment compensation commission in its unemployment report, now has approximately 75,000 unemployed, including 15 field men and women, and about 25 machine operators on temporary work for two or three months. The employment service has 215 employees in the Waynesville office and about 50 in the state.

### Disagreement As To Wage-Hour Act

Most of the objections to the proposed Federal wage and hour act which have been delivered to the Congressional committee hearing have been based either on historical or economical grounds. One group has contended that such legislation invades states' rights and is unconstitutional in spirit. The other has argued that federally to fix minimum wages means federally to fix all wages, which will produce a price rise, and finally a federal price-fixing law. With these dissents the administration forces behind the bill are concerned only to the degree that they may obstruct passage of the legislation.

### Flying Boats Making Scheduled Sea Trips

Taking off within a half hour of each other on Saturday of last week two flying boats, one British and the other American, which will operate the scheduled five and a half hour service between New York and Bermuda, took off from Long Island. They carried a group of forty passengers, governmental officials, executives of Pan-American Airways and Imperial Airways and newspaper publishers for a visit to the islands 770 miles away and for inspection of the service.

### Doctor's Change Ideas On Birth Control Methods

American medical history was made last week. By a unanimous vote of the house of delegates of the American Medical Association governing body of American medicine, birth control was recognized as proper, medical practice, and a 25-year-old opposition was formally ended. The New York state

doctors proposed at the convention at Atlantic City last week that the government participate in medical care. The proposal which was regarded as a turning point in United States medical history, was scheduled by the house of delegates for hearing by a committee with any of nearly 10,000 doctors attending in the convention privileged to express their views.

### Cadets Marry Day After Graduation

Diplomas were handed to 298 graduates of the military academy on June 12th, by General Malin Craig, Chief of Staff of the United States Army. At the time 293 of the graduates were commissioned as second lieutenants. About one-third of these are expected to go into the air corps under orders not yet made public. Starting life on a second lieutenant's pay of \$125 a month, sixty-seven of the new officers announced their intention of marrying immediately. Thirteen of the weddings took place the following day, despite it happened to be the 13th, in the cadet chapel. All get a three months graduation furlough.

### Woman Pays Gift Tax Of A Million

A Federal Government gift tax claim of \$1,413,323 against Mrs. Helena Woolworth McCann, eldest daughter of the late Frank W. Woolworth, five-and-ten cent store owner, has been settled for \$1,088,889.30. Settlement of the claim was disclosed last week when Mrs. McCann's agent presented a check for the amount to Joseph T. Higgins, collector of internal revenue, for the third New York City district. The check was one of

the largest representing gift taxes received in recent months by the collector's office. Collector Higgins, however, declined in accordance with regulations of the internal revenue bureau to give any information concerning Mrs. McCann's gift taxes. He said such information could not be obtained only from Washington, unless the tax payer saw fit to give out information concerning the gifts made.

Question: How can I cure colds in my young chickens?

Answer: Colds usually are caused by overcrowding, chilling, overheating, an unbalanced diet, or a drafty house and the first step should be to find the cause and correct it. The worst cases should be destroyed and Epsom Salts given to the remaining birds at the rate of one-half pound to each two and one-half gallons of drinking water. This should be kept before the birds for one day and a suitable germicide kept in the drinking water while there is evidence of the trouble. Usually an outbreak of colds runs its course and if good management and sanitation is practiced only a few birds are lost.
