

Local Scouts Win Many Places In District Rally

One hundred and ten Boy Scouts took part in the first annual district rally at Canton on last Saturday. The Scouts put on a parade down Main street, and held their demonstrations and contests in the City Park.

The three troops from this end of the county won ten ribbons, Troop 2 (Rotary troop) got 4, Troop 3 (American Legion) won 5 and Troop 5 (Hazelwood) received 1.

In the tub lifting contest, Wallace Roberson, of Troop 5 won first place, while Ben Colkitt of Troop 2 won third place.

Troop one, of Canton, won first place in the blanket stretcher race, and troop 3, of Waynesville, took second place.

First place in the life line contest was won by Waynesville troops 2.

In the knot relay, troop 1, Canton, first; Waynesville troop 2, second; Canton troop 4, third; Canton troop 6, fourth.

The fire and string burning contests were won by Canton troops, with the exception of third place which went to Waynesville's troop three.

The tent pitching event was not entered by Waynesville troops.

Kenneth Palmer, Waynesville troop 2, won the dressing race, taking 2 minutes and 54 seconds. Richard Bradley, of Waynesville troop 3, took second place in the same event.

Miss Bright lacked 16 quality points, which were necessary before she could graduate.

Judge Ervin discussed the motion from the bench, at length, saying that it was a novel case, and that he would like to have his ruling passed on by the Supreme Court. He could not agree, he said, that the defendants had made any contract to give Miss Bright a primary B certificate.

Justice H. Black Has Arrived Home

Justice Hugo Black and Mrs. Black quietly boarded the steamer "City of Norfolk," at Southampton, England, last week for Baltimore where the vessel docked yesterday morning, bringing home from his vacation in Europe the man who for two weeks has been the Nation's greatest storm center. During more than a week in London since the storm broke in this country he had steadfastly refused to answer any questions regarding his alleged membership in the Ku Klux Klan, past or present. In London he secluded himself in his hotel room and asked that visitors and telephone messages be kept from reaching him. On the small steamer, City of Norfolk, likewise he asked for privacy during the eight-day voyage.

Being interviewed upon his arrival Black declined to answer a point-blank question as to whether he was a member of the Klan.

"When I have any statement to make on any subject I will make it in a way that cannot be misquoted, and so the public can hear it," he declared.

When asked if that meant a radio speech he said the press might fail to print some parts of his statement.

GENERAL STRIKE IN POLAND IS THREATENED

In Warsaw, Poland, this week a general strike was threatened because five charwomen were dismissed from public utilities service on a charge of selling vodka in street lavatories. Sympathizers with the discharged women paralyzed street car traffic, overturning several cars and thousands of other utilities employees quite work demanding that the women be reinstated.

Unemployment Count To Be Finished Dec. 1

After a Hyde Park conference recently, John D. Biggers, administrator of the unemployment census, said President Roosevelt had approved final plans for the voluntary enumeration and that he expected the count to be completed by December 1st. Biggers added that the President had approved an expenditure up to \$5,000,000 and had given him "adequate authority."

Death Claims Girl Who Slept For 67 Months

The death of Patricia Maguire, who has slept for 67 months in the grip of encephalitis lethargica, in a coma which baffled the world's most learned specialists and defied all the remedies science had devised, died on Tuesday night with pneumonia, her system weakened by her long sleep and an abdominal tumor. An autopsy may be performed, and the doctors claim, may lead to some knowledge of the disease. Miss Maguire, a perfectly normal girl of Chicago, age 26, had influenza in 1931, apparently recovered, and the next year developed periods of drowsiness, and finally fell asleep, never to be aroused again.

Japan Begins Fourth Heavy Assault On China

Japan began the fourth "big push" in an effort to capture Shanghai. Airplanes are active and naval guns are pouring streams of shells into the city after the mine explosion. Japanese authorities described yesterday's activities as only the prelude to a major drive.
