Applications for emergency crop and feed loans for 1938 are now being received at court house here by S. S. Williams, field supervisor of the Emergency Crop and Feed Loan section of the Farm Credit Administration.

The loans will be made, as in the past, only to farmers who cannot obain credit from any other source. The money loaned will be limited to the farmer's immediate and actual cash needs for growing his 1938 crops or for the purchase of feed for livestock, and the amount which may be loaned to any one farmer in 1938 may not exceed \$400.




