Crop And Feed Loans Available

Applications for emergency crop and feed loans for 1938 are now being received at court house here by S. S. Williams, field supervisor of the Emergency Crop and Feed Loan section of the Farm Credit Administration.

The loans will be made, as in the past, only to farmers who cannot obtain credit from any other source. The money loaned will be limited to the farmer's immediate and actual cash needs for growing his 1938 crops or for the purchase of feed for livestock, and the amount which may be loaned to any one farmer in 1938 may not exceed \$400.

Farmers who can obtain the funds they need from an individual, production credit association, bank, or other concerns are not eligible for crop and feed loans from the Emergency Crop and Feed Loan section of the Farm Credit Administration. The loans will not be made to standard rehabilitation clients whose current needs are provided for by the Farm Security Administration, formally known as the Resettlement Administration.

As in the past, farmers who obtain emergency crop and feed loans will give as security a first lien on the crop financed, or a first lien on the livestock to be fed if the money borrowed is to be used to produce or purchase feed for livestock.

Where loans are made to tenants, the landlords, or others having an interest in the crops financed of the livestock to be fed, are required to

WASHINGTON.—Liquor tax receipts in 1937 totaled \$587,305,610, an increase of \$8,223,731 over 1936, according to reports of the Internal Revenue Bureau. Of this amount \$278,365,238 came from fermented malt liquors, such as beer, while \$236,360,574 was collected as domestic excise taxes on distilled spirits.

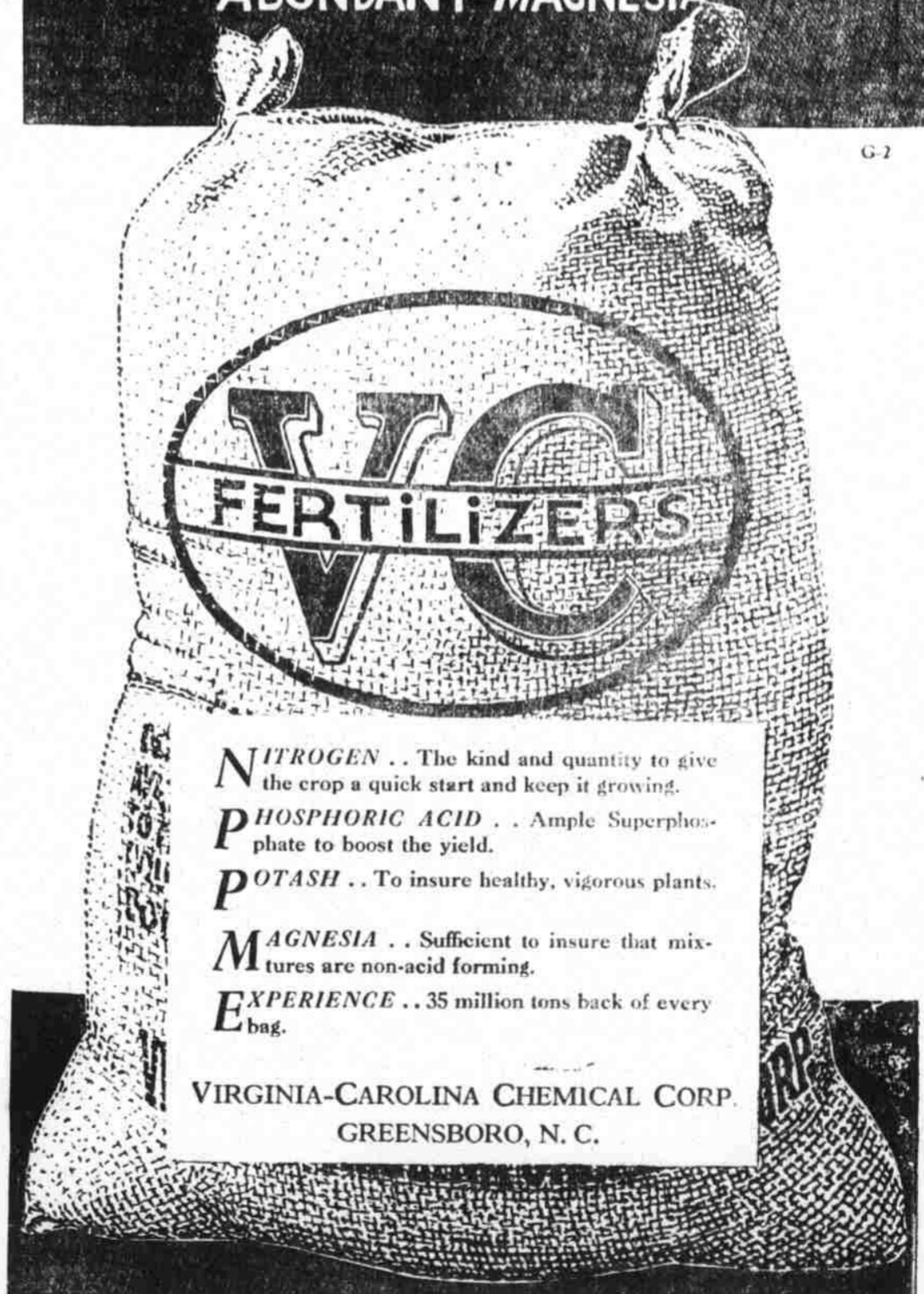
