Children Must Be Six Before Oct. 2 To Enter School

County Superintendent Cites Ruling Attorney General And School Legislation

There seems to have been a misunderstanding regarding the age of children for enrollment in the schools, as there have been cases in several of the schools of the county where the parents were under the impression that the children were of the proper age, and they have not been allowed to enter.

Jack Messer, county superintendent of education, cites the section in the school legislation passed by the 1937 legislature as follows upholding the action taken by the teachers: "Section 22½. fore, entitled to enter school this year under section 22½ of the school Machinery Act (quoted above.)
