

Duke, State, and Carolina will take on three leading Southeastern Conference foes. State meets Alabama at Birmingham on October 8; Duke entertains Georgia Tech at Durham on October 15; and Carolina has scheduled Tulane for Home-coming Day, October 8.

The season will keep running whitehot until December 3, when State closes its season against The Citadel at Wilmington. This will be the first time in years that a Big Five school has had a December contest. Dur-
