Boy Scouts Buy 700-Acre Tract

Mr. Allen on Monday night, "As soon as practical Camp Daniel Boone will be moved to the new location. The move will place the camp within an hour's ride of 90 per cent of the scouts in the council. Probabilities for the development of advanced and pioneering types of camps will be almost limitless."

"The reservation will be a wildlife refuge and the increase in all types of birds, animals, and fish encouraged. Several sections will be devoted to the reforestation by scouts so that they can not only improve the site, but learn conservation of natural resources at first hand. Co-operation of national and state forest and game officials will be secured in this part of the program."

A training center for adult leaders of all branches of the scout program will also be developed. This will make it possible for training courses of various types, to be held to which men can come from all over the council. This has not been possible in the past due to lack of the necessary facilities.

The property is said to be in the shape of a "U" with the two arms extending from the valley of the Little East Fork of the Pigeon river to the steep woody slopes to the west. While at the bottom of the "U" runs the clear stream that will feed a lake of at least five acres when a dam is constructed on the site which has been described by competent engineers as one of the best for dam construction in this section.

Harry W. Love and R. Lee Ellis, of Asheville, have been in charge of gifts and bequests that will finance the purchase and development of the property.

At the meeting Monday night Fred M. Waters, of Hendersonville, was elected president of the Daniel Boone Council, succeeding W. Granville Taylor, of Asheville. Everett Mitchell, of Asheville, and B. C. Burgess, of Spruce Pine, were named as vice-presidents of the council.

Other officers chosen were Hubert C. Jarvis, of Asheville, treasurer. Morris Lipinsky, of Asheville, as assistant treasurer; Wythe M. Peyton, of Asheville, commissioner; Harry W. Love, of Asheville, trustee for term expiring in 1943; and R. Lee Ellis and Mr. Love, member of the national council. The latter three, together with Mr. Jarvis and Mr. Lipinsky, were re-elected.

Elected to the executive board were: G. L. Hohlitzel, of Andrews, Dr. C. W. Whinnant, of Burnsville, Francis C. Bourne, of Asheville, R. L. Prevost, of Hazelwood, Mr. Love, Mr. Lipinsky, Mr. Jarvis, and the Rt. Rev. Robert E. Gribbin, for terms expiring in 1943; Hugh Monteith, of Sylva, for term expiring in 1941. Mr. Monteith was named to fill a vacancy created when H. E. Ochsner moved to another state.
