

By BETSY NEWMAN Ham Loaf with Relish

Baked Potatoes Gramed Cauliflower Spring Salad Grape-Apple Sherbet Graham Crackers of Sweet Wafers Coffee or Tes

HAM LOAF - Ingredients: one pound smoked ham (ground), one and one-half pounds fresh pork (ground), two eggs, two cups corn flakes, one and one-fourth cups sweet milk, two teaspoons meat sauce. Mix thoroughly, form in loaf and sear. Baste every 15 minutes with one-half cup brown sugar, onehalf cup weak vinegar, one-half cup water and one tablespoon mustard. Bake two and one-half hours at 325° F.

Grape-Apple Sherbet - Ingredients: one cup granulated sugar, one cup grape juice, one-fourth cup lemon juice, one and one-half cups orange juice, one-eighth teaspoon salt, two cups unsweetened strained appleaauce. Add sugar to fruit juices, stirring until dissolved. Add the salt and applesauce and stir well. Pour into freezing tray of automatic refrigerator with control at coldest setting. Freeze until set, stirring every 30 minutes until the mixture will hold its shape.
