

Question: What percentage of soybeans can I add to the ration for my hogs without injurious ef-

Answer: Recent experiments at this station have shown that as much as fifty per cent of the ration may be soybeans for pigs from 61 to 100 pounds in weight. When the pigs reached 100 pounds the ration was changed to corntankage containing 13 per cent cottonseed meal and this was continued until the animals were slaughtered at 230 pounds. Out of 153 hogs used, 148 or 96.7 per cent of the chilled carcasses graded firm.

30-Day Camp Of Military Training For Business Men

plication for a special camp, just authorized by the War Department, for training 300 business and professional men in the Fourth Corps Area. This is being held in connection with the Citizens Military Training Camps, the first time such a course has ever been offered in this corps area,

This camp for patriotic civic eaders between the ages of 25 and 50 will be for thirty days, from July 8 to August 6, at Fort Mc-Pherson, Georgia. Applicants who are accepted will provide transportation at their own expense and will pay for their own meals at the Regular Army ration rate for the camp. Regular Army uniforms and equipment will be used. All training and administration will be conducted by Regular Army and Reserve personnel, who will organize the camp and train the 300 trainees. No obligation rests upon these trainces for military service in the Army, and no commissions will be granted on completion of camp.

The Military Training Camps Association is sponsoring this plan of training which will be nationwide in every corps area. The object of these camps is to bring together business and professional

men from all sections under the most favorable conditions of outdoor life, to stimulate and promote citizenship, patriotism and Americanism.
