### Dr. Stuckey Is Named Geologist To Succeed Bryson

Dr. Jasper L. Stuckey has been appointed state geologist to succeed H. J. Bryson, according to an announcement made this week by Director Bruce Etheridge, of the department of conservation and development. Dr. Stuckey has served as head of the geology department at North Carolina State College for the past 14 years.

Prior to this, he was state geologist from 1920 to 1926 when he resigned to join the faculty at State College. He was succeeded by Bryson, who resigned this spring to accept a position with a mining concern in this part of the state.

Dr. Stuckey will continue on the college faculty devoting himself on a part time basis to the administrative functions of the geology position.

### —TIMELY— Farm Questions and Answers

**Question:** What percentage of soybeans can I add to the ration for my hogs without injurious effects?

**Answer:** Recent experiments at this station have shown that as much as fifty per cent of the ration may be soybeans for pigs from 61 to 100 pounds in weight. When the pigs reached 100 pounds the ration was changed to corn-tankage containing 13 per cent cottonseed meal and this was continued until the animals were slaughtered at 230 pounds. Out of 153 hogs used, 148 or 96.7 per cent of the chilled carcasses graded firm.

**Question:** Can seed Irish potatoes from the early crop be used to plant the late crop?

**Answer:** Seed from the spring crop of such varieties as Cobblers, Early Rose, and Bliss Triumph may be planted for the late crop if the seed are sprouting, but a better plan is to secure seed potatoes from last year's crop which have been kept in storage. It sometimes takes three or four weeks before sprouting begins even if the seed are covered with hay or straw and kept moist until sprouting occurs. In any case, plant only those seed which have sprouted.

**Question:** What is the best time to cut corn for silage?

**Answer:** The proper time to cut corn for silage is when the grain is denting and the shuck slightly yellow. This stage of maturity is reached about a week to ten days before the corn is ready to cut and shock. If cut earlier the nutritive value of the silage will be lowered and the acid content often increased to an objectionable level. If the harvesting is delayed beyond the proper stage of maturity the crop will not contain enough moisture to pack and keep well in the silo. If sorghum is used for silage this crop should not be cut until the seed in the head are firm.

### 16-Inch Gun Roars in Coastal Defense Tests



One of the giant 16-inch guns of the Coast Artillery at Fort Tilden, Rockaway, N. Y., "speaks" for the first time in five years as America brushes up on its defenses. The gun was aimed at a theoretical enemy 15 miles at sea, and scored several hits on the 18-foot-square target. Each shell costs \$3,000. The test indicated any invader would receive a warm welcome.

### 30-Day Camp Of Military Training For Business Men

First Lieut. George H. Ryder, of Canton, County Chairman of Haywood County is now taking application for a special camp, just authorized by the War Department, for training 300 business and professional men in the Fourth Corps Area. This is being held in connection with the Citizens Military Training Camps, the first time such a course has ever been offered in this corps area.

This camp for patriotic civic leaders between the ages of 25 and 50 will be for thirty days, from July 8 to August 6, at Fort McPherson, Georgia. Applicants who are accepted will provide transportation at their own expense and will pay for their own meals at the Regular Army ration rate for the camp. Regular Army uniforms and equipment will be used. All training and administration will be conducted by Regular Army and Reserve personnel, who will organize the camp and train the 300 trainees. No obligation rests upon these trainees for military service in the Army, and no commissions will be granted on completion of camp.

The Military Training Camps Association is sponsoring this plan of training which will be nationwide in every corps area. The object of these camps is to bring together business and professional

men from all sections under the most favorable conditions of outdoor life, to stimulate and promote citizenship, patriotism and Americanism. Men in these camps will receive expert physical direction and training of individual benefits. Selection of men for this training will be based primarily on educational qualifications and civic leadership in the local community. A special course will be given the trainees applicable to men of more advanced age and experience.

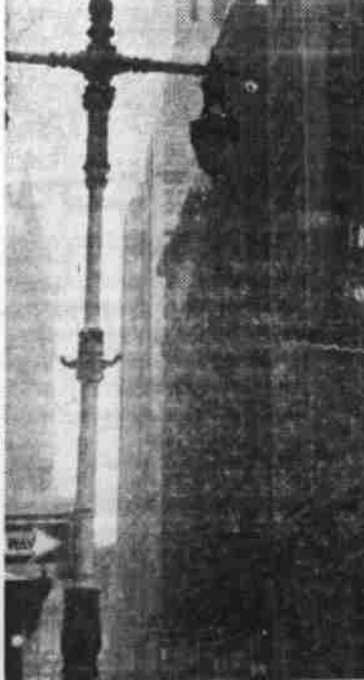
