

In the e three divisions of the Social Security Act, the Federal Government provides one-half of the funds and the state and counties one-fourth each, with a state equalizing fund to help the smaller counties. Prior to January 1, unit furnished one-third each for aid to dependent children.

No county figures are available for old age and survivors insurance. Monthly payments in this division started after January 1, 1940, due to a 1939 amendment, of lump-sum payments for three years. This will, in due time, become one of the most important of the five major divisions of the Social Security Act.

These five "service" divisions reports are approximate. The 1940 census figures of 3,561,990 for the state and 34,719 for this county were used in prorating the funds, made up of federal allotments, matched by the state and counties.

clothes, was destroyed.


