A number of games were enjoyed and all participated in the dancing of the "Old Virginia reel."

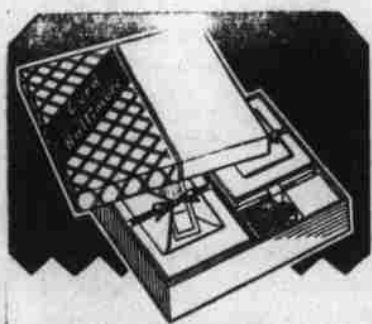

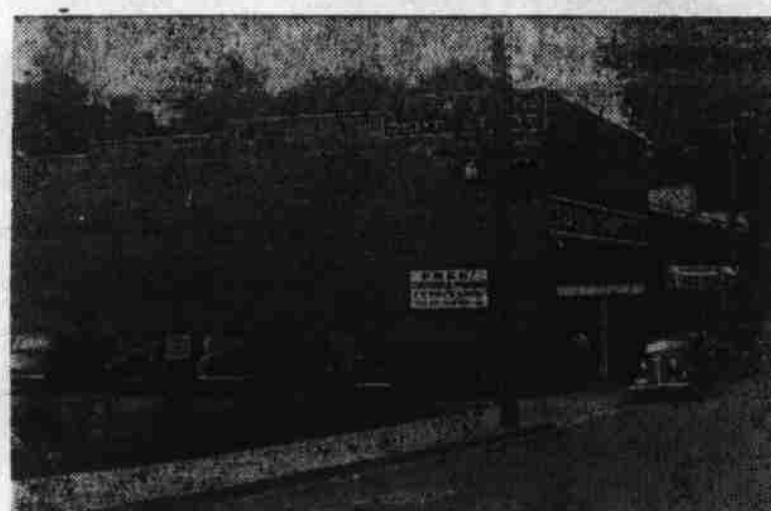
