

The refusal of these men to come to the supper of the man who had invited them was an insult, for none of the excuses given were important enough to keep them away if they had wanted to partake of the Lord's bounty. The things we are doing may seem of large importance to us at the time; but are they, when we consider what it means to us to be forever kept away from His hospitality?

Next Jesus reminded those that followed Him that in order to be a true disciple, it was necessary for a man to leave all his kith and kin-even to hate them if they would hinder him in his missionand to "bear his cross and come after Me." He must not value






