L. I. Case of N. C. Extension Service Visits County

"I have not seen the calves in other counties of the state, but the calves now being fed by the Haywood County 4-H Club members are the best I have ever seen," said L. I. Case head of the animal husbandry of the state extension service, who with the county farm agents took part in the monthly weighing of the animals.

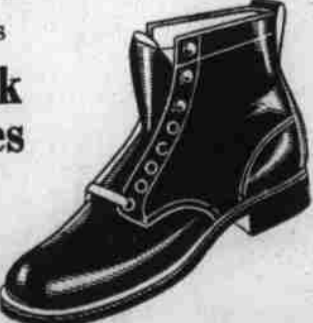
