Les Steers, University of Oregon, recently leaped 6 feet 10 3/4 inches to better the world outdoor high jumping record. The previous mark was 6 feet 9 3/4 inches, jointly set by Cornelius Johnson, Compton Junior college, and Dave Albritton, of Ohio, in the 1936 Olympic trials.

Mel Walker has a 6 foot 10 inch mark submitted to the A. A. U. for recognition.
