Youthful Host Gives Birthday Party At Home At Soc Gap

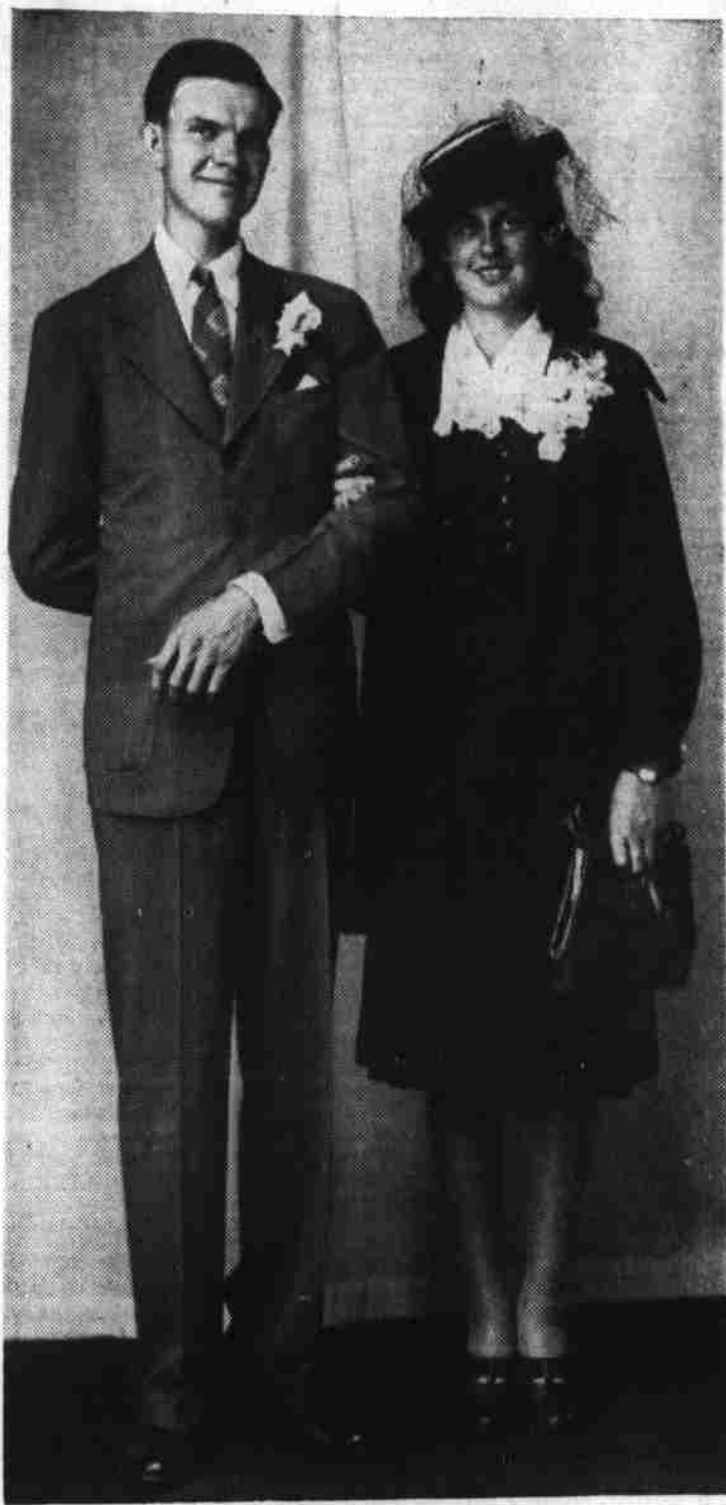
