NEW YORK.—Tin Pan Alley's batteries, featuring saxophone and fiddle rather than bugle and drum, are ready to open fire on Japan.

Song publishers reported today that lyrics are pouring into their offices and that at least two pugna-cious pieces are in the hands of the printers.

"You're A Sap, Mr. Jap" and "The Sun Will Soon Be Setting (For The Land of The Rising Sun)" are two new ones you'll be hearing shortly.

Some other titles: "Let's Take A Rap at the Japs," "The Jap Won't Have a Chinaman's Chance," "Taps for the Japs," "We're The Guys To Do It" and "Good-by Mama, We'll See You in Yokohama."

How close song writers watch new developments for inspiration is evidenced by an announcement since Monday the percentage of patriotic numbers had increased from one-third to more than one half of the total songs received.

The amount of rejections, publishers said, was "terrific," but Sam Lerner clicked with "The Sun Will Soon Be Setting," a fox-trot in semi-material tempo which Lerner said he wrote late Sunday night after the Japanese attack on Hawaii.

# FIREWORKS

## In Haywood County or Towns Therein

An Act to Prohibit the Sale of Fireworks in Haywood County

### The Law

**Section I.** That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale, shoot, fire, discharge, display, or otherwise use or have possession of any fire crackers, torpedos, cap pistols, sky rockets, Roman candles or otherwise articles commonly known as fireworks in the County of Haywood: Provided, however, that for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this Act the sheriff of the county and the chief of police in all municipalities within the county are hereby empowered and authorized to issue permits for use in connection with the conduct of public exhibitions, such as fairs, carnivals, shows of all descriptions and public celebrations, but only after satisfactory evidence is produced to the effect that said pyrotechnics will be used for the aforementioned purpose and none other. Any person desiring to secure a permit as aforementioned, shall make application to the sheriff of said county or to the chief of police of the municipality in which said pyrotechnics are to be used.

**Section II.** That any person violating the provisions of this Act shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding fifty (\$50.00) dollars or imprisonment not exceeding thirty days.
