Comfortable Hens **Produce Better**

When the cold winds of winter blow, that's the time to thing of the comfort of the farm poultry flock, says C. F. Parrish, poultry man of the N. C. State College Extension Sewice. tension Service.

A comfortable house, free from drafts, will help to keep the birds free from common winter ailments and aid them in producing a maximum number of eggs.

Then, too, each bird should have

at least 31/2 to 4 square feet of floor space. If the flock is crowded, additional space should be provided or the number culled down to a point where the birds may be comfortable in present quarters.

Water that has been heated to

knock the chill off, or fresh from the well early each moning, will do much to prevent a cold snap from causing a sharp drop in egg production. For less trouble, au-tomatic electric or oil heated warm-

ers should be installed. In other suggestions for De-cember to North Carolina poultrymen, Parrish said the feeding of one pound of alfalfa leaf meal per 100 birds will be a satisfactory substitute for green feed if the dry fall prevented the sowing of s

grazing crop.
If the flock is properly housed
