Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity; for God loveth a cheerful giver.

A gift is a precious stone in the eyes of him that hath it; whithersoever it turneth, it prospereth.

He that giveth unto the poor shall not lack; but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse.
