## Rubber Shortage Is Serious, Says Miller

not have automobiles, and they got along. We will have to learn to do the same."

Mr. Miller pointed out that all non essentials of rubber had been withdrawn from production. "No more rubber heels, no more golf balls, or baseballs. Only a limited

number of bladders for footballs. No rubber thread for elastic cloth, and foundation garments."

When questioned, Mr. Miller said that it took about seven years for a rubber tree to mature and produce sufficient sap to be commercially valuable. The possibility of developing South American rubber plantations would require several years, he pointed out. Last year South America produced only 3,750 tons of the 600,000 used in America, he said. Over 99 per

cent of America's supply comes from the East Indies. Rubber trees grow in a 400-mile belt at the equator.

"We must not take this shortage lightly. It is serious, and everyone must take utmost care of what they have. The chances of replacing anything in rubber soon is very slim," he continued.
