taking part on the program were, Bob Gibson, commander of the American Legion, Paul Davis, president of the Chamber of Commerce, Chrest George, World War veteran, and Lt. Byrd of the State Guard.

Judge Alley in his usual eloquent manner outlined the history of the progress of liberty and stated that next to the Christian religion it is the most sublime and instructive lesson taught in the annals of mankind. He spoke of American liberty and the price that had been paid for what we enjoy today.

"In this land of freedom and opportunity North Carolina has developed into the very best state in the best country in all the earth. But now we are asked to give up all this. Hitler and Mussolini have declared many times that one of the main objects of the present war is the utter destruction of all English-speaking people in every land," said Judge Alley.

"Speaking for myself," continued the judge, "rather than be ruled and dominated by the yellow devils of Japan and those monsters in human form, Mussolini and Hitler, I would sooner be ruled and dominated by that Devil of ancient fame and renown who presided over the regions of the Eternally damned."

"But I, for one have no fear that we will have to give up the American way of life, and the blessings that we have always enjoyed. We will have to suffer, yes. Some will make the supreme sacrifice on the bloody field of carnage, others will meet their doom above the clouds, still others will fill watery graves at the bottom of the mighty deep; billions of dollars in money and property will be expended. But the result we shall attain will be well worth the price we shall be required to pay," said the speaker.

Judge Alley while assuring the crowd of his confidence in the ultimate result of the war, stressed the fact that people did not realize what they would be called upon to give up before the victory was won.
