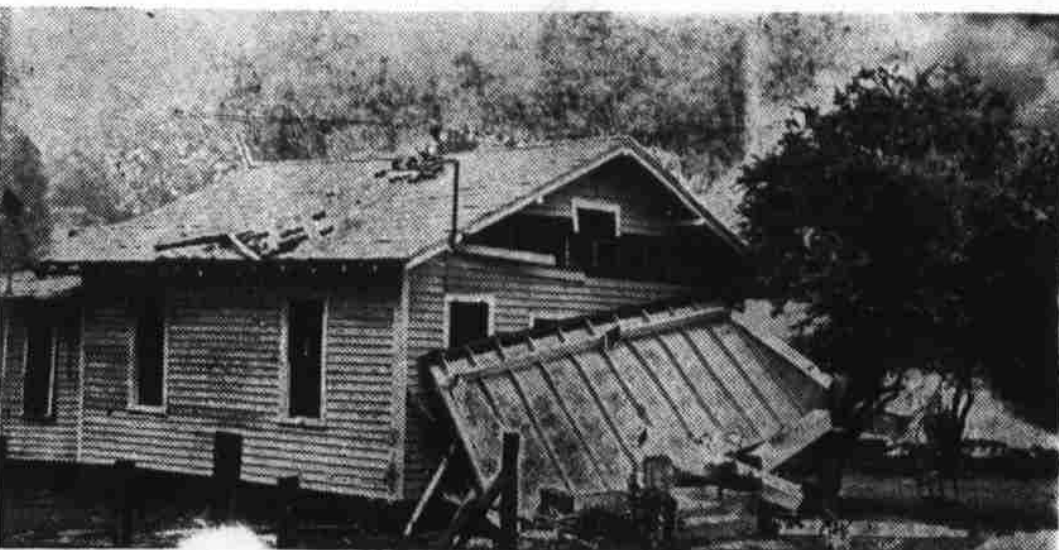
Grandson of Mrs. Burgin Made Outstanding Record At Wake Forest College
