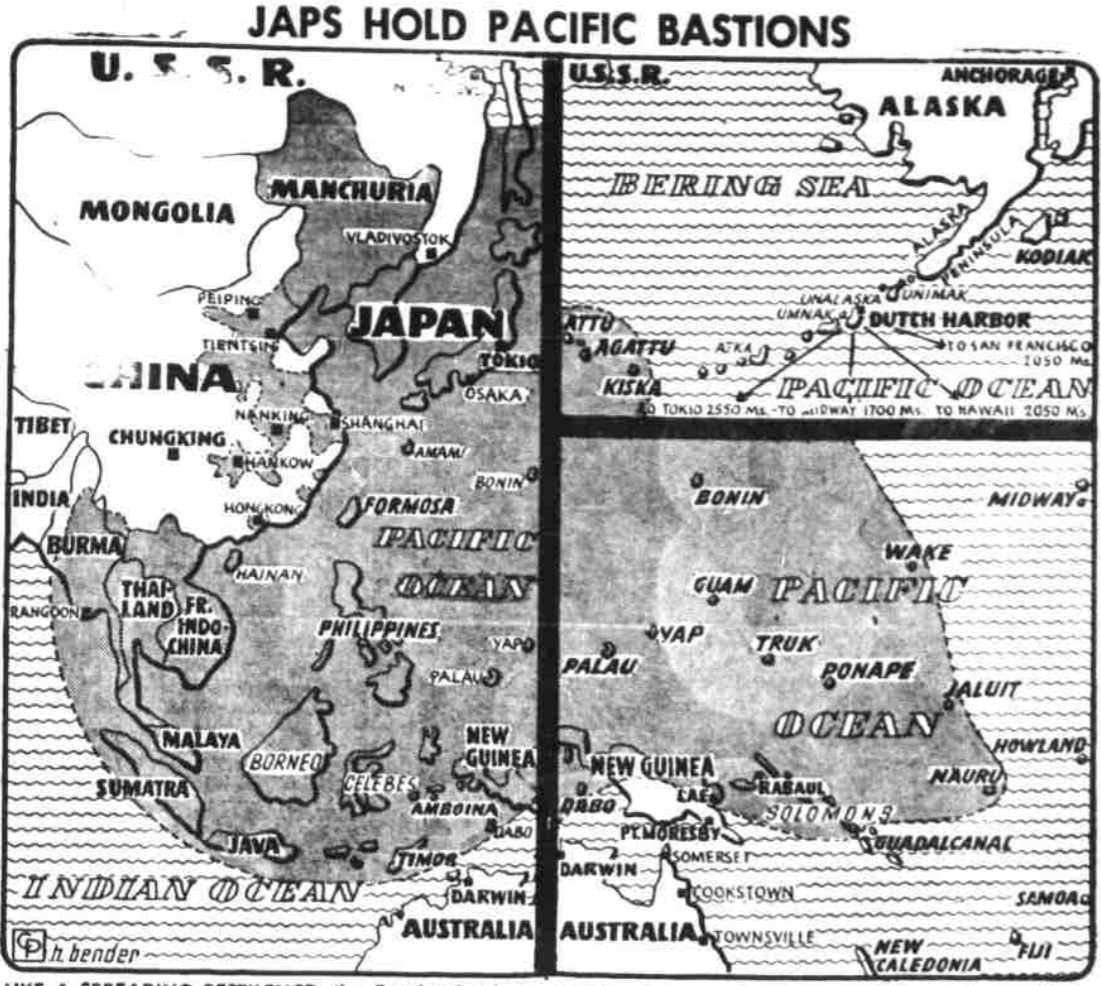


Waywood Baptist Association WMU Meets Here On 11th

Loans Available For Purchase Of Dairy Cattle

The Regional Agricultural Credit Corporation is now making loans to farmers to purchase dairy cattle, including heifers and calves. These loans are made to farmers for the purchase of cows that have been acquired by the Commodity Credit Corporation which county supervisors of the Farm Security Administration are acting as agents for. This program is designed to prevent the loss of such cattle as productive units through slaughter and to insure their utilization in the production of milk and milk products that are necessary for both civilian and military needs. Glenn A. Boyd, chairman of the county USDA War Board, stated that any one interested in this proposition should either contact him or J. Yates Bailey, loan representative of the Regional Agricultural Credit Corporation.
