

Apples lead the way with 22 servings for the mouth. Figures show that in the 30-day period, the 50,000-man camp would consume 35,000 dozen fancy eating apples, plus 135,000 pounds of cooking apples served as sauce, stewed or baked. Men on the post would eat 60,500 dozen oranges and would use 42,000 dozen lemons.




