New Methods Keep Fighting Men Free Of Infections

How preventive measures have kept the American soldiers in North Africa almost entirely free of infectious and contagious diseases, is told in a report received at Headquarters, Fourth Service Command.

Before the Americans landed last November, the Medical Intelligence Service of the Army had complete details in hand as to the conditions to be guarded against, the report states, and the necessary measures were put into effect immediately.

One of the most effective forces against the hordes of mosquitoes has been a new lotion which the soldier rubs on his face, hands and other exposed parts of his body. Only a few drops of the preparation are necessary and one application will repel mosquitoes for more than six hours.

Flies and other insects are fought with bombs, not the kind that blasted the Axis, but a device that a soldier sets off with a trigger. It contains spray that kills all the flies and other insects in a room of ordinary size, but is harmless to humans.

The elimination of "cooties" is accomplished by an entirely new powder which is sprinkled on the clothing and this simple method does away with the elaborate apparatus which was used in the last war.

Breeding places of the insects were cleaned up by the Sanitary Corps by spreading fuel oil and arsenic dust on stagnant ponds and pools, while the Engineers and Quartermaster Corps contributed their share in the war on disease.

A Family Favorite

DON'T FORGET to serve a refrigerator cake once in awhile to satisfy the family's sweet tooth. I'm giving you a recipe for one that will not take any sugar, and is easy to make.

- Today's Menu**
 Savory Veal Steaks
 Boiled Potatoes or Fried Noodles
 Green Beans Lettuce Salad
 Jelly Refrigerator Cake Iced Tea
- Savory Veal Steaks**
 1 1/2 lbs. veal shoulder steaks
 2 tsp. flour
 1 1/2 tsp. salt
 2 tbsps. lard
- 1 1/2 tps. dry mustard
 2 onion
 1/2 c. water
 1 c. top milk
- Buy 3 arm bone veal shoulder steaks. Mix dry ingredients and pound into meat, and brown one side in hot lard. Sprinkle with remaining flour mixture. Turn and

cover with sliced onions. When second side is brown, add water, cover and simmer 45 minutes. Remove meat to platter, add milk to drippings, heat thoroughly and serve as sauce with meat. Serves 5 to 6.

- Jelly Refrigerator Cake**
 1 1/2 c. sweetened condensed milk
 1/4 c. lemon juice
 1/2 c. currant wafers
 jelly
 2 1/2 vanilla
- Turn milk into mixing bowl, blend in lemon juice, add jelly, heating it in with a fork. Line loaf pan with waxed paper, put in layer of wafers, cover them with jelly mixture. Continue alternating wafers and jelly mixture until all have been used, finishing with layer of wafers. Chill 12 hours or more in refrigerator. To serve, remove from pan, turn onto platter, and cut in slices.

The Office of War Information offers these pointers for homefolks writing to soldiers, sailors, and marines — based on suggestions gathered in a survey among servicemen at home and overseas.

- TELL HIM:**
 1. How the family is doing everything possible to help in the war.
 2. How anxious the family is for the boy's return.
 3. How well and busy the family is. Give details.
 4. How the family is getting along financially.
 5. What's doing in the community: news about girls he knows, doings of friends, who's marrying whom, exploits of the home team and other sports events, social doings, effects of the war on the home town. Reminisce a little about past events and places the boy used to visit. Enclose clippings

from the home-town paper.

- DON'T TELL HIM:**
 1. Your troubles. He has troubles of his own.
 2. Your complaints. He can't do anything about them.
 3. About things you are deprived of. He can't supply them.
 4. Doleful predictions about the future. He's fighting for that future, now.
 5. Unnecessary details about financial troubles. If there are things he should know about family finances, and he is in a position to do something about the situation, tell him. But don't string it out.
