

St. John's School Will Open For Season On Monday

St. John's School, at Waynesville, in all departments, will open on Monday, August 30. The academic year lasts nine months, until the first week of June. Registration for the coming term is being accepted at the school August 26 and 27.

St. John's School is a private school for pupils from the first through the twelfth grades. Additional features of the school are kindergarten, music department and commercial department.

High school courses are given in English, journalism, Latin, Spanish, history, sociology, general mathematics, trigonometry, geometry, biology, general science, chemistry, business, speech, music and art. The science department has a fully equipped laboratory for general science, biology, and chemistry. A library of general literature and reference material is accessible to the students at all times.

A special feature of the high school is the commercial department which offers courses in shorthand, typing, dictaphone, bookkeeping, filing, multigraph duplication, stenotypy, business English, general psychology and general business procedure. This course is open to post-graduate students.

St. John's kindergarten is open to children of both sexes from three to five years of age. They may attend the morning session from 9:00 to 12:00, or they may attend the all-day kindergarten from 9:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m. A lunch and two supplementary meals are served each day. The purpose of the kindergarten is to develop the personality of each child. To this end, there are courses in music, drama, art, dancing, and training and etiquette. Activities include games and outdoor recreation.

Offering courses in piano, organ, violin, cornet, clarinet, saxophone and trombone, the music department aims to ground students in the scientific principles of instrumental technique, in addition to giving them a thorough understanding of music in its esthetic, historical and social aspects. Arrangements can be made for a limited amount of private tutoring in grammar school, high school or college courses.

Tuition service from home to school and return for a nominal fee is furnished for students living within a four-mile radius of the school. Grammar school and high school classes begin at 9:00 a. m. and last until 3:00 p. m. Music lessons are given by appointment. Commercial classes are held in connection with the high school and also from 4:00 to 6:00 p. m.

St. John's School has a faculty of thirteen teachers: Rev. Vincent J. Mahoney, Sister M. Cordea, principal, Sister M. Aquinas, Sister M. Angelus, Sister M. Baptist, Sister M. Anthony, Mrs. Henry Tuttle, Miss Virginia Kellett, Sister M. Hermes, Sister M. Corinne, Sister M. Theonita, Sister M. Michael and Miss Marian Kramer.

Rev. Vincent J. Mahoney teaches religion in the school. He has had two years experience in teaching and holds a bachelor of arts degree from St. Charles' Theological Seminary, Overbrook, Pa. His major work was done in psychology.

Sister M. Cordea, principal of the school, teaches languages and history in the high school. She has had twenty-one years experience in teaching and has a master of arts degree from the Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C.

Sister M. Aquinas, superior of the convent, is head of St. John's School commercial department and teaches Spanish, science and mathematics. She has had seventeen years teaching experience and holds a bachelor of science degree from St. Joseph's College, East-Lansing, Md.

Sister M. Angelus, teacher of English in the high school, has had seven years teaching experience and has a bachelor of arts degree from St. Clare College, Milwaukee, Wis.

Sister M. Baptist teaches Latin and history in the high school. She has had twenty-five years experience in teaching and holds a master of arts degree from Marquette University, Milwaukee, Wis.

Sister M. Anthony, head of the music department, holds a doctor of music degree from St. Louis University, St. Louis Mo. She majored in music and has had twenty-six years of teaching experience. She holds a North Carolina teaching certificate in music.

Mrs. Henry Tuttle teaches physical education in the high school. She has a bachelor of arts degree from Converse College, Spartanburg, S. C., and majored in sociology.

Miss Virginia Kellett, instructor of journalism in the high school, has a bachelor of arts degree from Lenoir Rhyne College, Hickory, N. C. She majored in commerce and mathematics and holds a North Carolina teaching certificate in these subjects.

Sister M. Hermes, teaches the seventh and eighth grades. She has had fourteen years of teaching experience and holds a bachelor of science degree from St. Clare College, Milwaukee.

Sister M. Corinne, teacher of the fourth, fifth and sixth grades, has had thirteen years experience as a teacher. She has a bachelor of science degree from St. Clare College, Milwaukee, majoring in education.

Sister M. Theonita teaches the first, second and third grades. She has had eleven years teaching experience and has a bachelor of science degree from St. Clare College, Milwaukee.

Sister M. Michael teaches music and has had one year of teaching experience. She graduated from the music department of St. Clare College, Milwaukee. She also attended music courses at the American Conservatory of Music, Chicago under the personal supervision of Louise Robyn.

Miss Marian Kramer conducts the kindergarten. She graduated from St. Francis Nursing School, Peoria, Ill., and holds an Illinois State Certificate of Nursing. During the summer, members of St. John's faculty have been studying and vacationing in various parts of the country.

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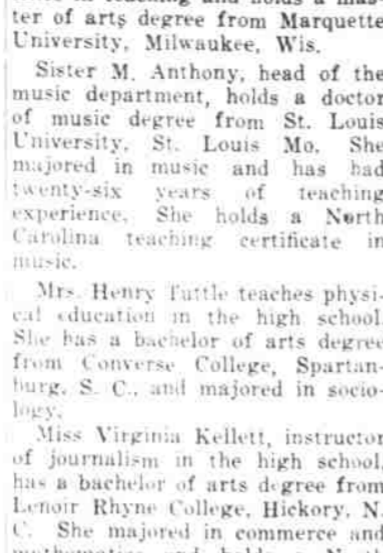

He is a graduate of the local high school, and was employed by the Newport News Shipyards as an electrician prior to entering the army in November, 1942.

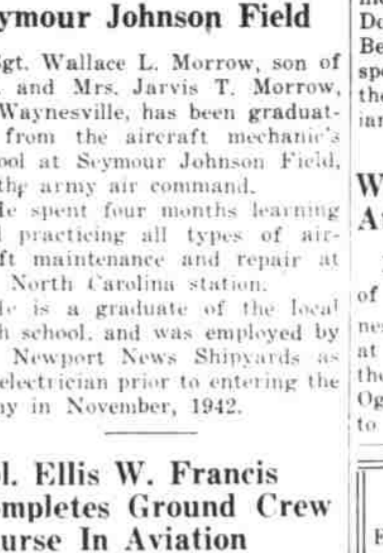
Cpl. Ellis W. Francis Completes Ground Crew Course in Aviation

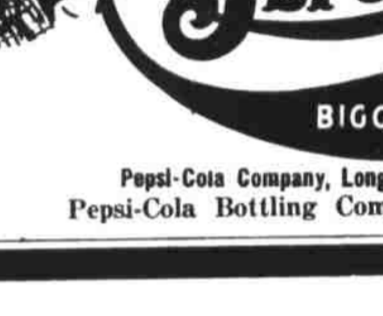
