If there is danger of the meat temperature going above 45 degrees and where hams ar to be held for prolonged storage, it is much safer to use a higher concentration of salt. Ask your county agent for Extension Circular No. 262 or write the Agricultural Editor, State College, Raleigh, for this publication.

Question: When should cattle be treated for lice?

Answer: Fall is the best season of the year to treat cattle for lice. says L. I. Case, Extension Animal Husbandman at N. C. State College. The treatments are most effective when the animals are taken off the grass, while the weather is still fairly warm, and before the cattle are placed in winter yuarters. This avoids getting the winter quarters infested with the biting louse. At least two treatments, 14 o 16 days apart, should be made. The first treatment will kill the grown lice, and the second will eradicate the lice that were unhatched at the time of the first treatment.




