

### St. John's Pupils Sell \$14,397 In Stamps And Bonds

Total For School To Date Now \$15,225. Enough To Buy 50 Jeeps.

Bonds and stamps purchased by students and staff members of St. John's Grammar and High School during the Fourth War Loan Drive totaled \$14,397.65. The total bond purchases at the school to date are \$45,255.00, enough to buy fifty jeeps.

A contest was sponsored by St. John's School for students and staff members selling most bonds during the Fourth War Loan Drive. The first prize, a \$25 war bond, was awarded to Richard Underwood, a freshman of the high school. The second prize, \$10 in war stamps, was won by Reeves Carver, fifth grade. The third prize, \$5 in war stamps, went to Jackie Cavanaugh, fourth grade.

The bond selling contest was limited to students, teachers and staff members of St. John's Grammar and High School. The campaign lasted during the four weeks of the Fourth War Loan Drive. Only "E" bonds and war stamps counted in the contest, at their face value.

Among the classrooms the fourth grade purchased the most bonds and stamps, \$3,863.30, the ninth grade ranked second highest with \$2,700.00 in bond purchases. The fifth grade held third place with \$2,403.65 in purchases.

Fifty new jeeps for our victorious armies is the total result to date of the various bond drives at St. John's. The mounting enthusiasm for jeeps which has swept through the school can hardly be described.
