Dewey Chambers, of the U. S. Navy, is visiting his parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Chambers.

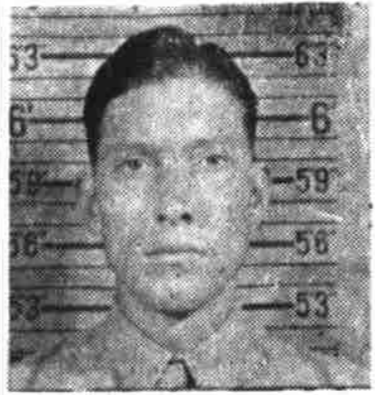
Betty Gene Alley Is Assistant Athletic Director At St. John's
