## **Hunting Privileges Are Announced For** the Pisgah Preserve

Wildlife Management Plans for the Pisgah National Forest were outlined recently by Carl G. Krueger, Forest Supervisor, and Chief Refuge Supervisor J. M. Longdeer, bear and squirrel will be held during the next few months, Mr. Krueger stated.

The Pisgah National Game Preserve and the Mt. Mitchel, Boone and Sherwood Wildlife Management Areas are jointly administered by the North Carolina Division of Game and Inland Wisheries and the U.S. Forest Service under cooperative agreements drawn up some years ago.

Always popular with the sportsmen, the hunts this year are expected to attract nimrods from all walks of life. Due to wartime restrictions on travel, local participation promises to predominate, although hunters from nearly every State in the Union have attended in other years.

#### Big Game Hunt on the Pisgah Preserve

Highlight of this year's activities will be the Tenth Public Big Game Hunt on the Pisgah Preserve, which is scheduled for the period beginning November 6 and ending November 18. Deer and bear of both sexes will be harvested in order to remove the animals which are surplus to the carrying capacity of the area.
