L. Dunavant entered the service in 1940 as a volunteer, and he had been a member of the National Guard for eight years. He had been overseas since August, 1943. Prior to entering the service he was employed by the A. C. Lawrence Leather Company.

He was a charter member of St. John's Catholic church, where memorial services were held in his honor, with a solemn requiem High Mass sung with Father A. F. Rohrbacher officiating, assisted by others, including an army chaplain.

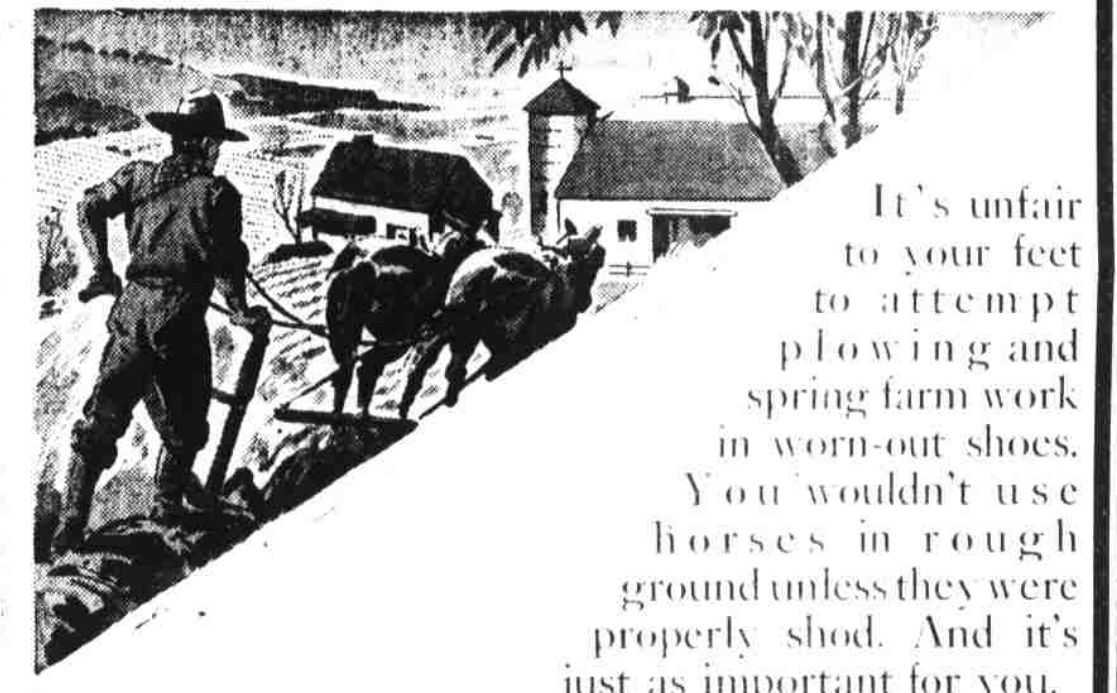

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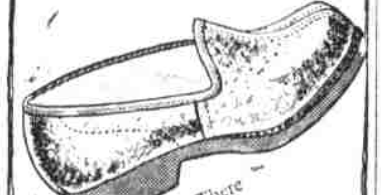


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
