
Completes Boot Survey Shows Veterans Want Government Jobs Approximately five per cent of the men in the Army have definite

plans to get a government job after discharge, and an additional five per cent think they will probably seek government employment but do not have clearly formulated plans, Fourth Service Command Headquarters announced recently on the basis of a survey of postwar plans of troops made by the Information and Education Division, Army Service Forces.

Two thirds of the men who have definite plaus for governmental employment after discharge were in government jobs before entering the Army, the report states. This is interpreted as an indication that "at present there are few signs of any great pressure by


