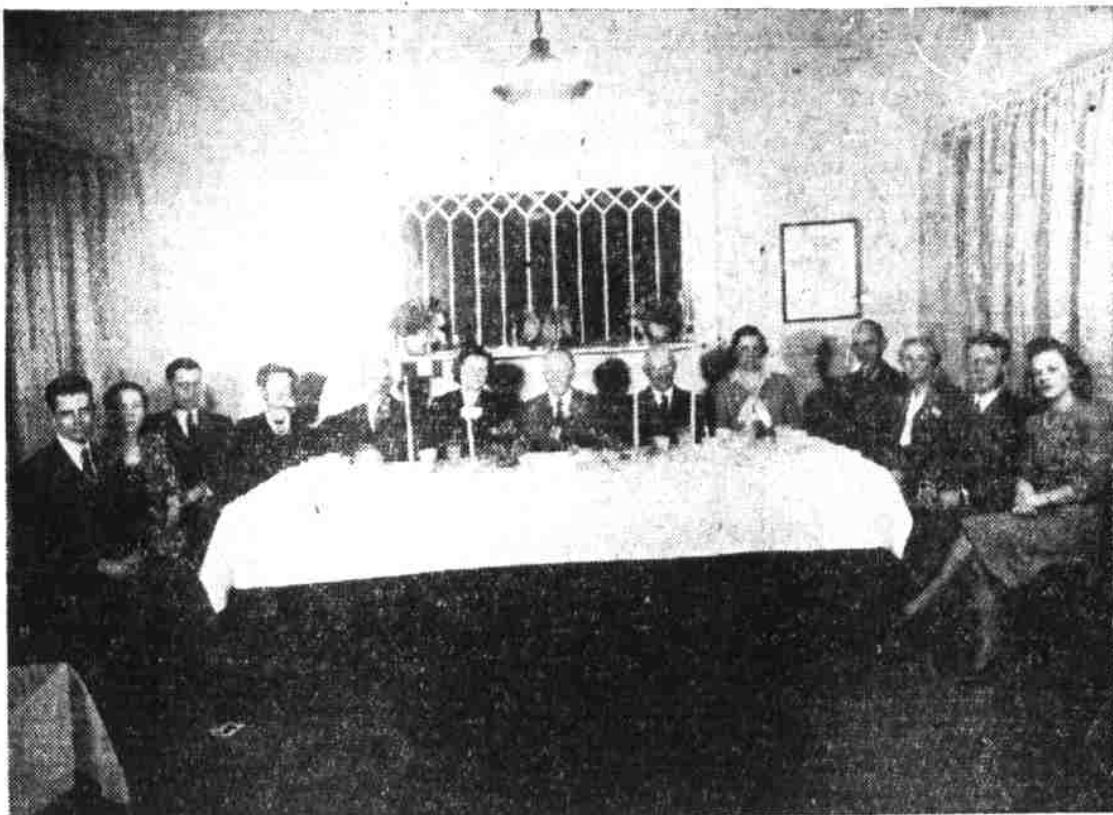

Survived Sinking



SERGEANT Avery E. Wilber, 32, of Appleton, Wis., survived the capture of Corregidor by the Japs and 30 months in Philippine enemy prison camps, only to be taken with some 1,300 fellow prisoners aboard a small Jap transport for transfer elsewhere. The ship was torpedoed by an Allied sub and all the prisoners perished except Wilber and four others. They managed to get aboard a lifeboat and make their way to China. Wilber said that most of the prisoners on the boat were Americans. (International)

Wife Preservers



Washed-out collars can be freshened at home. Make a small bowl of soda, using one part of soda to three parts warm water. When mixture is thick lather with one hand. Brush nose dust from velvet collar, then apply soda with a clean brush, holding back and forth lightly. Wipe up soda with a scrap of clean cloth, wring almost dry in lukewarm water. If properly done the collar will be only slightly damp. Steam collar over a boiling tea kettle and when completely dry, brush it lightly to bring back the nap.

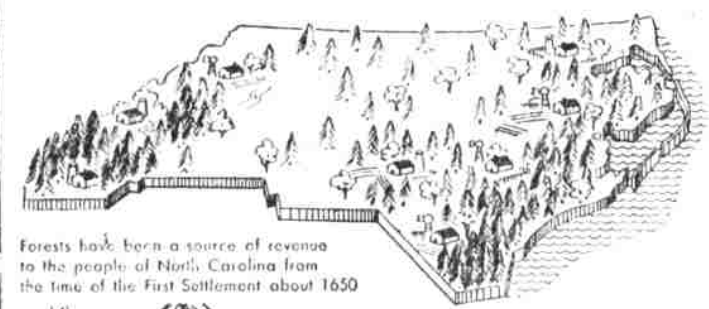
Rotarians Will Hold Banquet For Wives On Friday

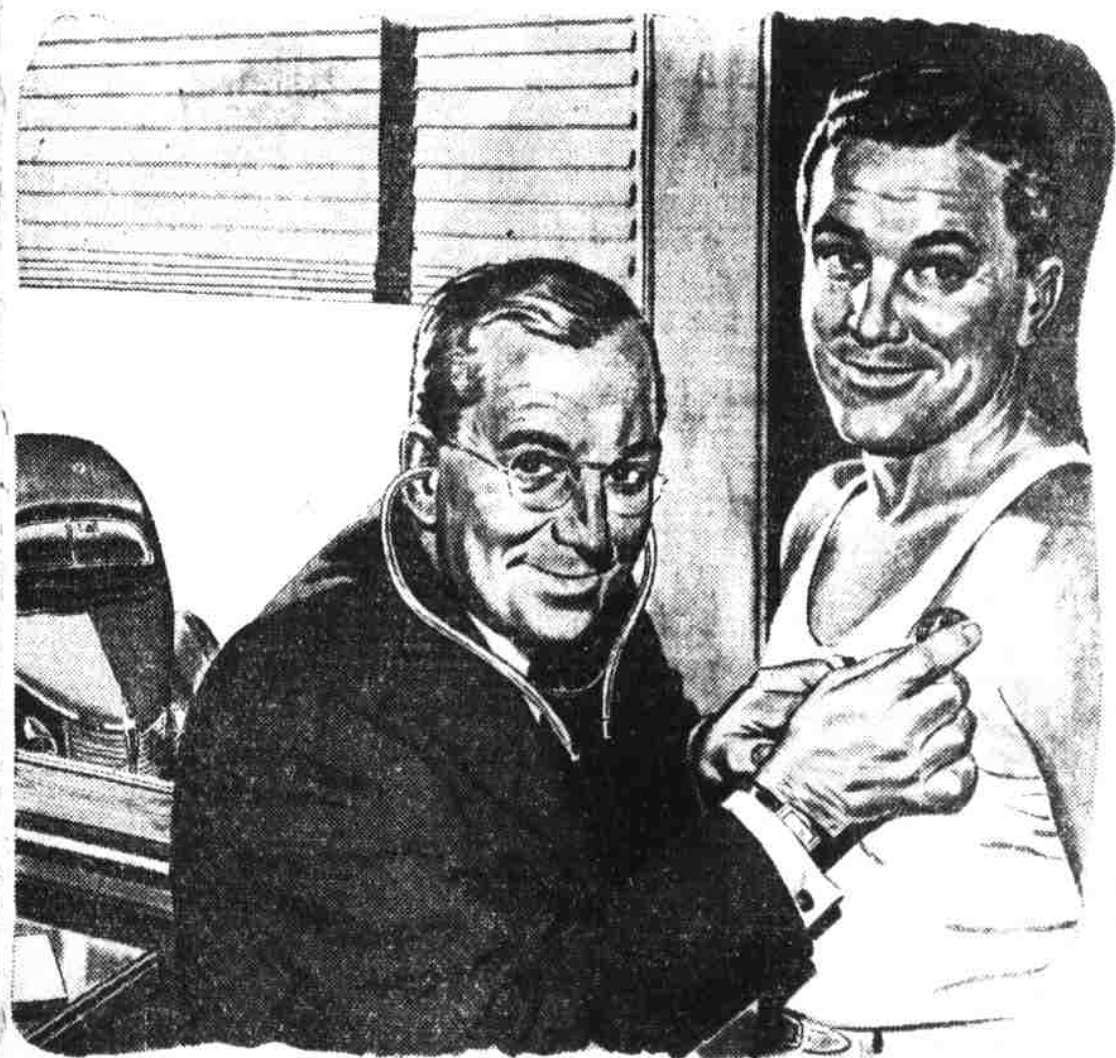
