PFC. HILLIARD McGAHA, son of Mrs. Catharina Hannah, who was killed in action in Belgium on Sept. 7, 1944 has been posthumously awarded the Purple Heart. The letter in part from Col. George Smith, Jr., commander to Mrs. Hannah read:

Your son was killed in action on Sept. 7, 1944 in Belgium and was buried Sept. 9, in a U. S. cemetery in Belgium. Services were conducted by a Protestant chaplain with fellow soldiers attending.

Your son was outstanding in bravery, loyalty and had a keen sense of duty and aggressiveness. Fellow soldiers join me in sending regards to his family in their bereavement.
