Private First Class Herbert Tate, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. G. Tate of Wayneville, RFD No. 2, has recently returned from 18 months in the European theatre. He entered the service as a volunteer in June, 1943, and was inducted at Camp Floyd.

He was sent to Fort McClellan, Ala., for his basic and was later transferred to Fort George Meade, Md., and then sent overseas. He served in England, France, Belgium and Germany.

Pfc. Tate was twice wounded, the first time on June 25 in France, and the second time on October 2 in Germany. He is entitled to wear three major combat stars for fighting in Normandy, Belgium and Germany; Purple Heart, with cluster; Good Conduct medal and European theatre ribbon.
