

Chemistry Expert Tells of "New Era From Chemistry"

Clemson College Professor Heard By Students At St. John's School.

Dr. M. H. Bruner, representative of the E. I. DuPont-Nemours Foundation, who lives at Clemson College, Clemson, S. C., delivered a lecture Monday afternoon at St. John's on "Better Things From Chemistry Living Through Chemistry."

In his talk Dr. Bruner expressed the fact that the war is being fought and won in the research laboratory, the home, the factory, and on the farm as well as on the fields of battle all over the world. While the war is still a struggle between men, Dr. Bruner went on to say, it has also become a scientific conflict between the numerous products of chemical engineering and technical research. Dr. Bruner told of the speed with which research has been used to develop numerous chemical products and replacements for unobtainable materials required for all-out war. Many of these materials come from the farm and forest—for example cotton and wood which are two of the basic farm resources of the South.

To illustrate the fact that large quantities of farm products eventually become weapons in the war for freedom as well as the necessities of everyday living and farming, Dr. Bruner displayed a wide selection of chemical products now being made, particularly those

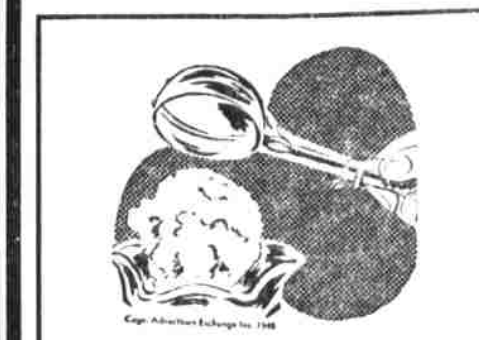
