Farm Questions and Answers

Question: How can I keep chickens from pecking out of my flock of chickens?

Answer: Vaccinate the chicks with chicken pox vaccine when they are 6 to 12 weeks of age, says H. C. Gauger, poultry pathologist of the Agricultural Experiment Station at State College. Directions come with the product and the cost averages about one cent or less per chick. Gauger suggests that the birds be examined about 8 days after the examination for "takes." If four-fifths of the chicks have a swelling or scab at the site of the vaccination, everything is fine. If there is less than 80 per cent "takes," the birds that do not show "takes" should be revaccinated.

Question: How can I control moles?

Answer: The best method of controlling moles is through the use of mole traps properly placed in the raised tunnel runways, says J. C. Whitcomb, in charge of predator and rodent control for the Fish and Wildlife Service at State College. He suggests that the spear type trap be used and that the ground be flattened for about 18 inches. The trap is placed in the middle of the flattened strip in the tunnel runway. Since moles feed upon grubs and worms, they are very hard to poison. Some have used a bait of rancid soaked overnight with a bit of strychnine injected into the runways with the point of a knife. This bait may be dropped in the runways. Field mice often frequent mole runs and they may damage the roots of shrubs, fruit trees, and bulb flowers. Therefore, damage sometimes attributed to moles is often caused by mice.

Question: Can I feed scratch grain along with starting and growing chickens to baby chicks?

Answer: This should not be done, says T. J. Brown, Extension poultry specialist at State College, because it dilutes the feed

and slows the growth of the chicks. When the chicks are about 5 weeks old they may be given a feeding of scratch grain late in the afternoon but the mash should be kept before them at all times. In some cases where the chicks do not get sufficient sunlight and are fed scratch grains, they develop rickets.

Wilson Rathbone, S 1/C, Serving On Indianapolis

Wilson Rathbone, seaman second class, USNR, is now serving aboard the U. S. S. Indianapolis, somewhere in the Western Pacific, according to information received from the fleet home town distribution headquarters in Chicago.

Seaman Rathbone fought aboard this heavy cruiser when her big guns pounded the enemy at Okinawa to avenge the dark days of 1942 when they spoke only defensively against the then dominant Japanese.

Recent exploits of the Indianapolis as a member of the potent Pacific fleet in attacks on Tokyo, Iwo Jima and Okinawa have erased memories of the desperate

delaying actions of three years ago.

She was in on the February air strikes by carrier planes against Tokyo and hasn't missed an important Western Pacific assault since then. Her gunners shot down six enemy planes at Okinawa and contributed to the pre-invasion bombardment of both Okinawa and Iwo Jima. In March she was part of the carrier task force that raised destruction on Kyushu and Honshu in the Japanese heartland.

She has fought the Japs in the Aleutians, in operations leading to occupation of the Gilbert Islands, in the Tarawa invasion, the seizure of the Marshalls, Eniwetok and Kwajalein and in the Marianas. She helped blast the Japs at Saipan, Guam and Tinian and was the first large American combatant vessel to anchor in Apra Harbor at Guam since the war began.

Seaman Rathbone's wife, Mrs. Louise Mae Rathbone, resides at Waynesville, R.F.D. No. 1.
