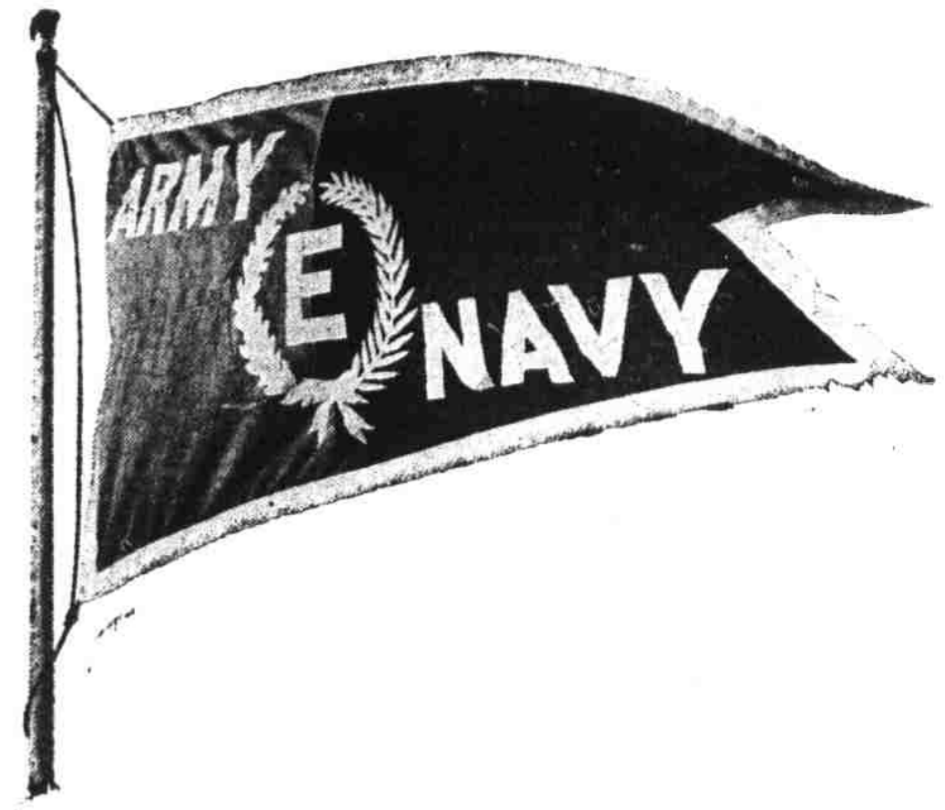

Pfc. Clyde L. Sexton, of Waynesville, is serving with the 96th Infantry Division on Okinawa, according to information received by The Mountaineer from headquarters of the Tenth Army.
He is a mortar man in the 382nd Infantry regiment and has found his experiences as a pitcher to be invaluable in the fighting on Okinawa.
During a Jap banzai attack, Sexton used his ability as a pitcher to heave hand grenades with deadly accuracy against the charging enemy. In the heat of battle he tossed 12 grenades in addition to firing his mortar at extremely close range. He is a southpaw.
