

F. Federation Declares Semi-Annual Dividend

Directors of the Farmers Federation have just declared the 26th consecutive semi-annual dividend to stockholders, James G. K. McClure, president, announced. This dividend will be payable July 1 to stockholders of record June 15, 1945.

The regular semi-annual dividend on common stock is 3%, he said. This will be paid in cash at the warehouses after July 1, and members of the Farmers Federation should call for their money there. The regular semi-annual dividend on preferred stock was declared, and checks covering the payment of this dividend will be mailed to stockholders.

The directors authorized an addition to be built to the Hendersonville frozen food lockers, Mr. McClure said. The plant now has 498 lockers, the addition will provide 250 more. So great has been the demand for lockers that these are expected to be rented in advance, mainly by persons whose

State College Hints

Growing pulpwood and lumber shortages will be felt by everyone in North Carolina during the summer and autumn as more drastic reductions in civilian supplies of familiar paper and wood products are enforced by the government to meet increased demands of the armed forces. I. O. Schaub, State College Extension director and chairman of Gov. Gregg Cherry's emergency committee on Forest Products Production, warns.

Curtailments ordered by the War Production Board will affect house-holders, farmers, school children, merchants, business firms and the average citizen alike, according to Dean Schaub. He makes an urgent plea to farmers, producers, suppliers, woodsmen and citizens in non-essential occupations to lend their assistance in the present crisis by producing more pulpwood and lumber now.

first for critical war requirements and secondly to assure themselves of adequate supplies for home front needs.

"Reduction in allotments of pulpwood products, particularly paper by the War Production Board, are the direct result of enormously increased demands of the military for the all-out fight against Japan and the steadily lessening volume of pulpwood available to mills," he explains. "These reductions will be felt in every department of domestic life during the third quarter of the year, beginning June 1 and continuing through September. Even more drastic cuts are certain unless pulpwood shortages can be overcome by vastly increased production."

"The leaves of good hay constitute from one-third to one-half of the total volume of the hay but they contain about two-thirds of the total protein. Save those leaves."

Of the 489 prisoners of war in North Carolina, 189 are harvesting food and feed crops. 30 are

in dairy work, and 270 are engaged in general farm work.

Areas where trucks are urgently needed to prevent the impairment of farm production will be allocated reasonable quantities of surplus trucks, says the Department of Commerce and the WFA.

North Carolina farmers have signed contracts for 1,500 Bahaman workers, scheduled to arrive between June 20 and July 9.

Thousands of extra workers will be needed for harvesting the coming tobacco crop. See your county agent.

The cooperative wool pool at Asheville is scheduled for June 27. All wool should be tied with paper twine.

When death comes suddenly to cattle after they have been placed on pasture the trouble may be blackleg. The animals should be examined by a veterinarian.

Forty million dollars has been

authorized for beef cattle production payments to feeders. Ask for details at the local AAA office.

World hog numbers show a 13 per cent decline. In January hog production was about 25 million head less than the year before in the U. S., Canada and Mexico.

An improved cotton tire cord has been developed in research laboratories. There is also a new development in rotproofing cotton goods.

Sunshine increases the vitamin C content of tomatoes except where the plants are undernourished, thirsty and suffering from loss of foliage, say the experts.
