## County Welfare Deptment Renders Aid During Year

"As the stats and its counties prepare to go into another fiscal year next week, North Carolina public welfare agencies look forward to yet greater accomplishments in 1945-46 than in the year coming to a close on Saturday," said Mrs. Sam Queen, county welfare superintendent, yesterday in discussing the work of the department.

During the past 12 months Haywood county has increased its average payment monthly to needy aged persons from \$10.83 to \$11.50. The state-wide average has gone up from \$10.67 to \$12.50, according to Mrs. Queen.

In this county there were 497 persons receiving old age assistance last June as compared with 504 this month.

Haywood county has increased its monthly average grant to families of dependent children from \$13.47 to \$16.40 for the 90 families now receiving aid. A year ago there were 85 families receiving aid. The state average payment to dependent children is \$24.76 for the month of June, 1945. A year ago it was \$18.29.

A year ago there were 91 private homes in North Carolina in which children could be boarded temporarily while arrangements were being made for their permanent care. Now there are 121 homes although a good number of them are in some of the more populous counties. Haywood county has two licensed boarding homes and every effort is being made to provide at least one more during the coming year, according to Mrs. Queen.

Mrs. Queen said she had been advised by the State Board of Public Welfare at Raleigh that 39 of the 139 city jails and lockups had been inspected during the year along with all county homes and county jails.

### Ironing Setup
