Timely, Practical Household Suggestions by Ruth Currant of State College

Question: What is wrong with my lima bean seed? Answer: Howard Garriss, Extension plant pathologist, says that the seed are infected with the yeast spot disease which is caused by a parasitic yeast organism. The disease is spread from the soil or by insects, particularly the southern green stink bug. The small type lima beans are especially susceptible. He suggests that you plant only healthy seed control the insects as much as possible, and plant some of the larger type limas.

Question: Can you tell me why the eggs in my incubator pip and do not hatch properly? Answer: Research work shows that there are generally three reasons for this condition says T. T. Brown, Extension poultry specialist. First, low average humidity, second, low average temperature, and third, excessively high temperature for a short period. You seem to be using plenty of humidity and so Brown suggests that you check your thermometer. If you find the thermometer to be accurate, he further suggests that you write the manufacturer a letter similar to the one you wrote him. You should be able to get more than 250 to 275 chicks from 375 fertile eggs.

and wood products will be scarce? Answer: Yes, says R. W. Graeber, in charge of Extension forestry at State College. There is a shortage of workers in the woods and at the mills, and only about three-fourths as much lumber and pulpwood is being produced as is needed for the armed services and civilians. The list of restricted items include commercial printing, book papers, wrapping and paper bags, towels, napkins, facial tissues, and similar products. Containers, paper liners for fruit boxes and crates, wax and parchment type papers for wrapping, and multi-walled bags for bulk shipment of farm produce are likely to be added to the list before the close of the summer.
